For many years, being 39 was seen as the last year of youth, and the ensuing year began the start of a grind towards slowing down and doing less. Society no longer feels that way – now it's "life begins at 40, 50, etc." So, although the CJO is now 39, our recent, vibrant years only point to an increased impact that we are having in our Northeast Ohio communities.



As an attendee to one of our Season Series Concerts, you are experiencing our best known activity. Over the years, the CJO has presented jazz's finest performers, innovators and writers. And at every Season Series Concert, you'll hear original arrangements and compositions created for and by the CJO, especially from our gifted and award-winning Artistic Director, Paul Ferguson. These singular, sonic moments are then rendered at a world-class level by our region's finest musicians, ensuring that you'll hear "the best jazz you've ever heard, and the best jazz you've never heard."

But, we are doing so much more than this!

Did you know that:

- * A residency program with Cleveland Metropolitan School District Middle Schools is now in its fourth year and has more than doubled in size! This instruction is both impactful and unique we know of no other instance of a jazz organization instructing students of this age bracket. Depending on the school, the student and the collaborating CMSD teacher, our CJO instructors guide these students from beginning on their horns to learning about jazz and publicly improvising.
- * Our instrument donation program has now taken in over seven dozen instruments. These donated instruments are cleaned, refurbished, and all the necessities are provided before we give these to students or schools in need. Donors receive a free pair of tickets to a CJO concert.
- * We give away dozens of free student tickets to each Season Series Concert.
- * We provide funding for CJO musicians to work with students as guest artists, clinicians and adjudicators.
- * Throughout our region, as "CJO in the City," CJO groups of all sizes perform for nonprofit benefits, private events, and in parks, clubs and theaters.

The ONLY reason we have been able to conduct all of these important cultural and educational activities has been through the support of so many donors and grantors through our first 39 years. It is this generosity that enables the CJO to thrive – we welcome you to help us share even more with our region.

Very happy to showcase a new arrangement by Aidan Plank, "In the Bleak Midwinter." My children sang this in the Episcopal church growing up. I'm offering new versions of "Carol of the Bells" and "Sleigh Ride," both of which will feature a magnificent young talent, Ava Preston. We also have a fresh angle on a Sephardic tune "Adio Querida" ("Farewell, my Beloved"), which we dedicate to our late friend, Reggie Kelly. Reggie sang with us just two years ago, magnificently, and was scheduled to perform at the Bop Stop in a few weeks. We dedicate tonight, and especially this tune, to his memory.

AVA PRESTON

Ava Preston is a 18-year-old vocalist and songwriter from Cleveland, Ohio. When performing her wide array of jazz and blues standards, audience members often describe her as an "old soul." Ava is a 2023 YoungArts Finalist and Silver Award Winner for Jazz Voice. She is also a 11x national Downbeat Student Music Award Winner: 6x for Vocal Jazz Soloist 2018-2023 and 5x for Blues/Pop/Rock Soloist 2018, 2020-2023. Ava was selected as the vocalist for the Next Generation Jazz Orchestra, which brings together 20 of the most accomplished high school jazz musicians in the country, culminating in a main stage performance at the 2023 Monterey Jazz Festival in September.

An active singer in Northeast Ohio, she began her career singing at a jazz club when she was 10 years old. A few years later she was featured at a number of local venues including The Bop Stop, BluJazz+, Nighttown, Beachland Ballroom, Brothers Lounge, The Standard, Tri-C JazzFest, and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, to name a few. She has also performed with the Cleveland Jazz Orchestra, Dominick Farinacci, Swingbone, Moises Borges, and is the lead singer for two 17-piece big bands: Swing Time Big Band and Swing Era Big Band.

On the national scene, Ava has performed at Jazz at Lincoln Center - Dizzy's Club (NYC), Birdland Jazz Club (NYC), Small's (NYC), Bluebird Café (Nashville), Andy's Jazz Café (Chicago) and the Monty Alexander Jazz Festival (Easton, MD). Ava has been privileged to perform with such jazz greats such as *(Cont.)*

Christian McBride, Monty Alexander, John Clayton, and Sullivan Fortner. In 2017, Ava was honored to sing for Wynton Marsalis, who said she had "a gift...a lot of talent and personality." In 2019, legendary band leader and composer Paul Shaffer watched Ava perform her original song "Toy Soldier" and said, "That was a terrific song. You have a big future ahead of you."

As an aspiring songwriter, Ava has recorded a number of original songs that span jazz, indie, and pop/rock. Steve Bogard, songwriter of ten number one country songs, recognized Ava's songwriting ability when she was 11 years old at his songwriter's camp and encouraged her to visit Nashville. Ava released "Toy Soldier" in 2020 and is releasing three more originals in 2023. A passionate consumer of all types of musical genres and styles, she also loves to sing in French, Spanish and Portuguese. Ava draws inspiration from jazz legends like Ella Fitzgerald, Sarah Vaughn, Cyrille Aimee and Astrud Gilberto along with pop singer/songwriters like Sara Bareilles and Alanis Morissette

School Residency Program

What began in 2019 at CMSD's Ben Franklin Middle School has evolved into a full-year program, now at seven CMSD schools!

CJO's residency program is singular in its concentration on middle-school age students in developing instrumental music programs. Aside from the first few

weeks on an instrument, the attrition rate is highest in this age bracket, and the pandemic challenged many music programs severely.

Moreover, this program serves these students at THEIR schools and is part of their daily program, rather than offsite and after school, allowing for maximum participation and inspiration.

During the 2021-2022 school year, we introduced an instrument donation program, which puts instruments in the hands of students of need in Northeast Ohio. To date, we have received over 85 instruments to support these young artists.

CJO Masterclasses, Clinics, Guest Artists, & Adjudication

Every year, the CJO funds, in part, significant experiences for our region's students by helping place CJO members in schools as adjudicators, guest artists, clinicians, and in masterclasses. These can all be tailored to your school's specific needs.

Side-by-Side Concerts

CJO members work with students and prepare for a shared concert, featuring the sponsor school, as well as the CJO, performing both together and separately.

CJO Rehearsals in Your School

CJO will rehearse at high schools in the Northeast Ohio region, giving students the opportunity to watch up-close as the CJO sightreads, discusses, and masters new materials for upcoming performances.



Free Student Tickets

Students and their band directors can attend a CJO concert for free, in a "field trip" experience. CJO band members meet with the students and directors prior to the show for a Q&A.
